BASD-provided meals

According to PDE, it provides temporary benefits to families of school-aged children who would receive free or reduced-priced meals if school was in session. For each day school is closed, eligible families can receive the equivalent of the free high rate for lunch and the

severe need rate for breakfast. Specifically, a family will receive \$5.70 for each eligible school-aged child in their family for each day school has been closed since March 16, 2020.
